



**SUNY Plattsburgh
Start-Up NY Campus Plan Summary**

Building Space Available

On Campus: Redcay Hall, Building #15, 47 Beekman Street The 41,000 square foot red brick building permanently houses several departments including anthropology, sociology and criminal justice, which are scheduled to move to Beaumont Hall as part of the campus’ Facilities Master Plan at a later date. Also located in Redcay Hall, is a large conference room and several lecture/classrooms for the campus. The building is ADA-compliant and equipped with an elevator.

The designated START-UP NY space in Redcay Hall would include 32 offices (varying in sizes from 86 sq. ft. to 274 sq. ft.), a computing lab, and a storage area on the first floor. On the second floor, 12 offices (varying in sizes from 80 sq. ft. to 280 sq. ft.), a classroom, conference room, two storage areas, and two common areas would also be designated for START-UP NY.

Because this space in Redcay Hall is currently considered “surge space”, we use it for temporary quarters while renovations are made to permanent offices. A few of the offices on the first floor are temporarily occupied, but no other permanent departments or offices will be displaced as a result of the designation for START-UP NY.

The building is bounded on three sides by city streets, and a large campus parking lot. Delivery of equipment, supplies, etc. for the building is currently done through the main doors.

Land Available

On Campus: 8,868 Sq. Ft. would be made available in Redcay Hall, divided between two floors.
